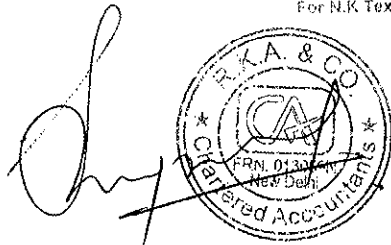



In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these quarterly and year to date financial results:

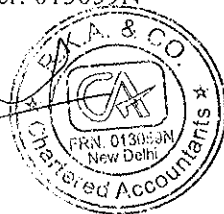

'We need to learn to take wickets in middle overs'

BRISBANE: Rohit Sharma's brilliant one of the positives in India's five-wicket defeat in the first ODI against Australia but one of the worrying factors according to the in-form opener is not picking up wickets in the middle overs.

India had Australia down at 21 for two but George Bailey and Steve Smith added 232 runs for the third wicket en route a comfortable win for the hosts.

"There were a lot of positives to be taken from that game especially scoring 300 runs in Perth. Losing is not a positive but we did whatever we could. And also the fact that Australia batted very well," Rohit said ahead of the second ODI at Gabba on Friday. "Our morale is high because we have played good cricket and we know that. Only thing is that we need to learn as to how we can take wickets in the middle overs and how to build the pressure," the opener was forthright in his assessment of the chinks in the team's armoury.

"It wickets fall in the middle, then it affects the momentum of the opposition team. That is what we need to do in this game because we batted well. We bowled well with new ball but were halted in the middle overs because we didn't take wickets then. And that's what we have to learn," Rohit added.

Conditions in Brisbane are expected to be much the same, with the pitch having a bit more

pace in it than the one at Perth. Even then, Rohit wouldn't confirm if the Indian team was contemplating playing four fast bowlers, considering that Ishant Sharma is now fully fit and available.

"There are discussions going on about picking four fast bowlers but we all have to wait and see what MS (Dhoni) thinks and what he feels is the right combination to go forward with. I here in Brisbane, it will be very similar to what we got in Perth. I guess there will be a little more bounce. And Perth was on the slower side a little bit, once the slime was taken off the ball, I think here it will be a little more and the fast bowlers will have a little more assistance through a

can do after that. So after getting a hundred, I start another innings, which starts from zero, and scoring another hundred and that's how I look at it. As a batting group, our aim has always been one batsman batting through as long as possible," he added.

"There was one criticism of his 200-plus runs partnership with Virat Kohli, and that was regarding the strike rate.

However, the batsman highlighted that there are no safe scores in ODI cricket anymore. "When you bat first you usually don't know what is a defendable score. You get 340 and again it's not a safe score anymore. When we were batting in the middle the idea was to capitalize and bat as long as possible, considering we have got a couple of newcomers in the middle order.

"I have looked at it and it is a good opportunity to get past the hundred. You challenge yourself and ask what else you

BRISBANE: Australian all-rounder James Faulkner reckons that the 22-year strip used at the Gabba for the second ODI against India will also be "flat" but at the same time more "competitive" than the WACA pitch where both teams enjoyed a run-fest. "I think any time over 300 runs is being scored and chased, it's definitely a flat wicket," Faulkner said ahead of the second ODI against India.



Myneni knocks Ramkumar out of Aussie Open qualifiers



MELBOURNE: Saketh Myneni moved to the second round of the Australian Open qualifying event with an easy win over compatriot Ramkumar Ramanath while Somdev Devdevam fell at the first hurdle, here.

Myneni spanked Ramkumar 6-4 6-1 in the opening round in just 66 minutes. Ramkumar, who created ripples at the Chennai Open by beating two higher-ranked players en route to quarter-finals, squandered three break chances in the second set.

Myneni, who was very consistent in 2015 season, broke Ramkumar once in the opening set and thrice in the second to seal the win in his favour.

He will next face Italian Lorenzo Giustino, who is ranked 261st as against Myneni's 168th.

Meanwhile, Somdev's forgettable run continued with his 6-2 1-6 4-6 defeat to Estonia's Jurgen Zopp, ranked 164th.

Real Madrid, Atletico hit by one year transfer bans

ZURICH: Spanish giants Real Madrid suffered another institutional embarrassment on Thursday as they and rivals Atletico Madrid were banned by FIFA from buying players for one year over their dealing in under-age players.

The ban will start from the July transfer window this year and finish with the January transfer market in 2017 meaning newly appointed Real coach Zinedine Zidane will be unable to strengthen his squad this summer.

Atletico were also fined 900,000 Swiss francs (820,000 euros) and Real 360,000 (330,000 euros). However, both clubs are still allowed to sign players until the end of the month.

"The two clubs were found to have violated several provisions concerning the international transfer and first registration of minor players as well as other relevant provisions with regard to the registration and participation of certain players in competitions," said a FIFA statement.

Atletico announced they will appeal, whilst Real made no immediate comment.

"We will appeal, we think we are right and I think this is unjust," said Atletico president Enrique Cerezo.

"Not being able to sign is a problem because the seasons are very long and you always need players. Fortunately, we have a good and big squad with young players that can overcome these two windows without signings."

European champions Barcelona have just completed a one year ban for similar reasons.

Barca were initially banned in April 2014, but managed to delay the sanction taking effect until the transfer window in January and the summer of 2015 by launching an ultimately unsuccessful appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS).

By delaying the ban, Barca managed to sign the likes of Luis Suarez and Ivan Rakitic in the summer of 2014 to propel them to a treble of La Liga, Champions League and Copa del Rey, a route potentially open to both clubs depending on how quickly CAS could hear any potential appeal.

Real and Atletico were "issued with a reprimand and given 90 days in which to regularise the situation of all minor players concerned," FIFA said. They can still sell players during the transfer ban.

FIFA said the alarm was raised over the two clubs by



without signings."

FIFA's Transfer Matching System and its disciplinary committee completed the inquiry.

Under international football rules, players under 18 cannot be transferred to another country, except in limited circumstances. All transfers need the approval of a special FIFA committee.

Madrid admitted in January that it had supplied FIFA with the details of 51 players as part of their investigation, which they claimed were exempt from the regulations for various reasons.

The news is the latest of field blow for Real having sacked two Champions League winning coaches in Carlo Ancelotti and Rafael Benitez in the past seven months, as well as being thrown out of the Copa del Rey for fielding an ineligible player.

The signing of Manchester United goalkeeper David de Gea was also frustrated at the last minute in August as the clubs failed to register the required paperwork in time. AGENCIES

To represent one's country at a world-level tournament is any budding teenage cricketer's dream, but to take part in two editions before turning 19 is a remarkable accomplishment reserved for a select band who display talent beyond their years. Host country Bangladesh's Mehidy Hassan Miraz will have the rare distinction of captaining his nation in two editions.

Apologise for your behaviour, Sardar tells Pak players

NEW DELHI: Indian Hockey skipper Sardar Singh on Thursday asked the Pakistan players to apologise for their "unacceptable" behaviour during the Champions Trophy in Bhubaneswar in December 2014, backing Hockey India's stand of not allowing the stars from across the border to play in IHL.

"Pakistani players are suffering a lot but what they did during the 2014 Champions Trophy was unacceptable. They still haven't apologised for their behaviour so I feel they shouldn't be allowed to participate in IHL," Sardar said on the sidelines of the unveiling of IHL, here on Thursday.

Nine Pakistani players were part of the first edition of IHL.

in 2013 but were forced to leave the country before the start of the tournament following protests from a few nationalist organisations. Since then no Pakistan player has been included in the last three editions.

"The coming edition of IHL, also doesn't feature a single Pakistani player and Hockey India made it clear that in future, too, they will not be considered until they apologise for their unruly behaviour in Bhubaneswar.

"The International Hockey Federation had suspended two Pakistani players Anjum Ali and Mohammad Tausif from playing in the 2014 Champions Trophy final after they were found guilty of making obscene gestures towards spectators following their semifinal win against India. AGENCIES

Moses hits out at doping in athletics

MUMBAI: American track legend Edwin Moses says what has happened in athletics, which has been hit hard by corruption and doping scandals, was a travesty of justice.

"I am the chairman of the US anti-doping agency. What has happened in athletics is a travesty of justice. I was one of the athletes who believed in true sports. I never took medical supplements but believed in diet and exercising. I could always say I represented the clean athletes," said the two-time Olympic 400m hurdles champion, Moses, who was unbeaten in the low hurdles for 122 consecutive races, including 107 finals, was addressing the media ahead of Sunday's Standard Chartered Mumbai Marathon for which he's the Event Ambassador. Indian-born Bodi named as player involved in match-fixing

JOHANNESBURG: Indian-born former South Africa batsman Gulam Bodi was on Thursday named as the player charged with involvement in match-fixing during the country's domestic T20 competition last year. Cricket South Africa confirmed that Bodi, who was in IPL side Delhi Daredevils' squad in 2012, has been charged under CSA's anti-corruption code for "controlling to fix, or otherwise impermissibly influence aspects of the 2015 RAMSLAM T20 Challenge Series". Bodi, now 37, played in two ODIs for South Africa, both against Zimbabwe, in 2007. He played in a 'single' Twenty20 International against the West Indies the same year. He was a member of South Africa's squad for the inaugural World Twenty20 in 2007, although he did not play in a single game. Bodi was born in Hathuran (Gujarat) in India and his family moved to South Africa when he was a teenager. He also played for the South Africa Under-19 side in the World Cup in 1998.

"Following our probe and due process, we have reached a point where we can confirm that Mr Bodi is the intermediary who was charged by CSA in 2012 against the West Indies CSA Anti-Corruption Code," said Haroon Lorgat. AGENCIES

Eng strike twice more, SA 152-3

JOHANNESBURG: England struck twice after lunch, removing 11 Ashim Anila and Dean Elgar to have South Africa 172-3 at the first day of the third Test here on Thursday.

Spinner Moeen Ali dismissed Elgar for 46, and pacer Steven Finn got Anila three overs later for 40 to give England a hint of ascendancy at the Wanderers as the tourists chase a first series win over South Africa in more than a decade.

England lead the four game contest 1-0.

Elgar and Anila were settled, and built a 73-run partnership before All created enough trouble to find the outside edge of Elgar's bat and have him caught behind by wicket-keeper Jonny Bairstow. Anila also nicked behind, leaving AB de Villiers and Pat du Plessis at the crease.

De Villiers was unbeaten on 29 after cracking four fours in an attacking start to his innings.

Ali, Finn and Ben Stokes all had one wicket for England, with Stokes removing Elgar's opening partner Stiaan van Zyl for 21 before lunch.

South Africa, under new captain De Villiers after Anila quit as skipper following the second Test, won the toss and are chasing a way back into the series.

Anila was coming off a double century in the drawn second Test in Cape Town and, relieved of the pressures of captaincy, was in free-flowing form with seven fours. De Villiers began in attacking style, taking one delivery to get his range before hitting Ali for back-to-back boundaries. AGENCIES

WORLD RECORD BY SANIA-MARTINA AS THEY WIN 29TH MATCH ON TROT

SYDNEY: India's Sania Mirza and her Swiss partner Martina Hingis on Thursday broke a 22-year-old world record by winning their 29th women's doubles match in a row en route to their entry into the women's doubles final of the WTA Sydney International, here on Thursday. The World No 1 pair came from behind to beat the pair of Romanian Raluca Olaru and Kazakhstan's Yaroslava Shvedova 4-6 6-3 10-8 in a closely-fought semi-final. They now surpassed the pair of Puerto Rican Gigi Fernandez and Belarus' Natasha Zvereva, who won 28 matches on the trot during their successful pairing back in 1994.
